## Pre-Kindergarten / Kindergarten Registration for 2020-2021



### Online Registration Begins April 28, 2020

**New Kindergarten students must be 5 years old on or before September 1, 2020.**

**STEP 1** - Complete online registration beginning on April 28th.

- Proof of Residency  
(purchase/lease agreement or one of the following: gas, water or electric bill)
- Parent/Guardian's Driver's License
- Certified Birth Certificate
- Child's Social Security Card
- Current Immunization Records

## Pre-K Registration

To enroll in Pre-K, your student must meet this specific criteria. Parents must fill out the Pre-K application located on the Aledo ISD Pre-K/Kinder Department webpage and upload it to the registration portal while completing online registration. If you are unable to upload the application, you may bring it with you to Coder Elementary during August registration.

You will be notified if your student meets the criteria after the application has been reviewed.

**To be eligible for enrollment in a Pre-Kindergarten class, a child must be at least four years of age as of September 1, 2020, and must:**

- be either unable to speak and comprehend the English language; or
- be from a family that is eligible to participate in the National School Lunch program for free or reduced lunches; or
- be homeless; or
- be the child of an active duty member of the United States Armed Forces, including the state military forces or a reserve component of the Armed Forces, who is ordered to active duty by proper authority; or
- be the child of a member of the United States Armed Forces, including the state military forces or a reserve component of the Armed Forces, who was injured or killed while serving on active duty; or
- have ever been in the conservatorship of the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (foster care) following an adversary hearing; or
- is the child of a person eligible for the Star of Texas Award as:
  - (1)a peace officer under Section 3106.002, Government Code;
  - (2)a firefighter under section 3106.003, Government Code; or
  - (3)an emergency medical first responder under Section 3106.004, Government Code.

To determine eligibility for students who do not speak and comprehend the English language, a home language survey and an oral proficiency instrument will be administered.
